PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1971

The 1971 Season has seen our overall playing performances decline as compared to the 1970 Season. This was to be expected as we suffered a severe setback due to the league boundary redistributive exercise. The loss of area, previously available to us, affected the strength of most teams fielded by the Club. The long term effect of the boundary redistribution on the C-Y.J.F.C. cannot be effectively gauged at the present time. However, despite the redistribution, the C-Y.J.F.C. teams overall performed very creditably. We had 5 out of our 6 teams contest the semi-finals. The U/18's, U/14's and U/11's were eliminated in their semi-final matches. Their playing performances in being narrowly beaten were full of merit and great credit is due to respective coaches, players themselves and supporting officials. The U/11 B's and U/12's were beaten in their second semi-final matches. Whilst our U/11 B's were comfortably beaten in their preliminary final match, the U/12's had a fine win in their match against Bayswater and qualified as a grand final contestant against Dianella. Dianella proved slightly the stronger side in the Grand Final to win the Premiership despite our spirited opposition - the margin, 5 points.

SOCIAL

Socially the Club made a significant advance with the implementation of a Cabaret in 1971. This function proved to be an outstanding success. Our sincere thanks are due to Les Beckham, Fred Holt, Merv Taylor, Len McCarthy and wives, as well as their many assistants. Heartened by the response and the favourable comments expressed, the Club has scheduled another Cabaret for late April 1972 at the same venue - Alexander Park. The traditional social functions, players teas etc. proved to be as popular as ever.

COOLBINIA OVAL

1972 should see us permanently domiciled in our new premises at Coolbinia Oval - a complex which the officials of this Club have worked so hard to secure. City of Stirling officers have assured us that there will be no impediment to an early start in the construction of change rooms and club rooms at the oval. So it is with keen anticipation that we await the commencement and eventual completion of our premises in the not too far distant future. Our sincere thanks to Max White for his outstanding efforts on our behalf in connection with this project.

FINANCE

The financial position of the club is sound at the present time, due in the main to our enthusiastic fund raisers. Our thanks go to Mesdames Morgan and Campbell, Messrs. Taylor and Forrest for their particular efforts in what is generally considered the more onerous of duties involving the administration of a football

club. Our reliable Treasurer Bob Stewart deserves a special mention in despatches for keeping his usual watchful eyes over our financial transactions, by keeping our ambitions within the bounds of our available resources. However, 1972 will require a maintenance of 1971 fund raising activity in view of our expected furnishings commitment in connection with our projected club rooms.

COMMITTEE

It is certain that in 1972, several important administrative changes will take place due to retirements etc. This can be beneficial to the club in the short and long term. Changes in personnel offer the opportunity for the stimulus of new ideas and enthusiasm for which a growing club must depend on to survive. To those who will retire at the end of this year, and those who continue to serve the club and its interests next year, thank you for a job extremely well done. My extra special thanks to Secretary, Bill Forrest, for his customary splendid work during the season. However, Bill has advised of his intention to retire at the end of this year from the position of Secretary, due to the heavy pressure of work associated with his employment. Bill will be available to serve the club in the capacity of committee-man in 1972.

CONCLUSION

The 1971 football season is now concluded for the C-Y.J.F.C. 1972 should see the club make significant forward strides in most areas. We can look forward with confidence to our immediate future. Our future is also tied to the future of the East Perth Football Club and particularly the East Perth Junior Football Council. Our mutual relations are of a very high order. With this in mind, I would like to record my appreciation of the friendship and co-operation of the President of the E.P.J.F.C., Mr. Jack Clayton and the Secretary of the E.P.J.F.C., Mr. Lisle Bremner, and also to the Secretary of the E.P.F.C, Mr. Hec Stempel and the coach of the E.P.F.C, Mr. Mal Brown.

This Club is most indebted to the National Fitness Council of W.A. for the generous assistance in the production of our 1971 Annual Report.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 1971 Junior Football Season is now over and we have all had time to reflect on our achievements for the Season. If we are to measure our success by the number of teams participating in Grand Final Matches and Premierships won then we can say we had a rather dismal year. If on the other hand we measure success on the number of lads who were introduced to football, the manner in which they were taught the fundamentals of the game, the great club spirit which prevailed during 1971, the enthusiasm of our coaches and officials and the manner in which our players conducted themselves both on and off the playing field then I feel we are justified in saying, "1971 was a great season".

BOUNDARIES

The W.A.N.F.L. boundary re distribution was a bitter blow to the club. We lost many promising young players and as our President has stated, the effects of these losses will be felt in the years ahead. Despite our losses it was most encouraging to witness the great club spirit which prevailed during this most worrying period. Some critics have implied that there is no such thing as tradition in a junior club. This may be so in some districts but it is not the case at Coolbinia. We proved this without doubt by the number of parents who were prepared to fight tooth and nail for the retention of our club. The East Perth Football Club and the Executive Members of our Junior Council are to be commended for the assistance and confidence they placed in our club and district. Without their whole hearted support we would never have been able to succeed.

OFFICIALS

Sound administration is the criterion of any successful club or business. Over the years we have always been fortunate to have many parents and in a number of cases non parents who have been prepared to accept the many duties associated with the running of our club and these efforts have all added up to sound administration and an excellent Junior Football Club. In this regard the 1971 Season has been no exception. I wish to thank all Officials for their co-operation and assistance and I know I will not be offending anyone when I make mention of special thanks to the following members:

Mr. Dave Cargill :- As Manager of our under 11 grade, Dave was faced with the mammoth task involving the introduction and registration of some thirty odd new boys and general control of 65 boys 10 years old and under. The enthusiasm of the kids at the commencement and during the Season was more than matched by the meticulous manner in which Dave overcame any problem. During the Season nothing was too much effort and every detail received his utmost attention. This particular help made my duties so much easier.

Mr. Ted Smith :- In addition to his duties as Manager of the under 16 grade, Ted has been a great backstop for me. Apart from organising the 100 Club hardly a week went by during the Season when I wasn't asking him to do something extra for the benefit of the Club. As always he has accepted these duties and carried them out in a most workman like manner.

Mr. Merv Taylor :- What do you say about a bloke like this? He has been a tremendous help and at times I feel as though I've been embarrassed by his enthusiasm.

Mr. Len McCarthy :- I feel Len needs a special mention for the manner in which he accepted the position of propertyman for our under 18 grade. His lads no longer play for the Club but this did not deter him when we were in trouble at the beginning of the Season.

The President Mr. Bill Crowe :- Bill has been President of the Club for the past five seasons and has been a very capable and diligent worker. I feel his efforts in striving to bring to fruition our new headquarters at Coolbinia are deserving of our highest praise.

Goal Umpires :- A special thanks is due to Rod Stonehouse, Norm Mackay and Les Beckham for their contribution during the Season. Our under 18 team is also very grateful for the assistance provided by Bill Fulcher and Neville Power.

NEW COMPETITIONS 1972

The 1972 season will see the replacement of the under 11 competition by an under 10 competition. This means under 12's will no longer be restricted to 11 year old boys. In future his grade will comprise of 10 and 11 year old boys. Most clubs had difficulty in fielding the required numbers in the under 12's during the season. In our case we are indebted to our under 11 grade players who helped to make up the team on most Saturdays. Next Season we will be fielding two teams in the under 12 competition and already have amongst our younger players the nucleus of an under 10 team.

TROPHY WINNERS

I wish to add my congratulations to those players who have been voted the Fairest and Best players for 1971. A special tribute is due to Glen Morgan the outstanding footballer in the club for the 1971 Season.

STATE SCHOOLBOY REPRESENTATIVE

Congratulations to Tony Morgan on his selection in the State Team which won the Australian Carnival in Launceston. Tony was mentioned as being one of the best players in several of the matches.

A CLUB RECORD

Due to boundary re distribution the Noble family was lost to the club. In the eight seasons from 1963 to 1970 each of the five sons played with the club and their total number of games amounted to 462 games. During the 1968 Season the family had the unique distinction of having a son playing in each of our five grade teams. Three of the sons Robert, Brian and Tim played over 100 games each and it is a great pity that the remaining two boys Doug and Leslie were

unable to reach this goal with the Club. Even so this imposing record of 462 games will stand as a Club Record for one family and if you add to this the two Club Premierships which were won by teams coached by their father Mr. Bob Noble it then becomes a very fine record. Congratulations to the Noble family for a grand contribution to Junior Football in the Coolbinia-Yokine District.

THE FUTURE

Our geographical position in the East Perth District is such that we are bounded to the South, West and North by the West Perth district and this naturally restricts the area and the number of players who are available to our club. It is very difficult to forecast just how much longer we will be able to maintain our strength in the lower grades. The establishment of our new ground and club rooms at Coolbinia will help to stimulate further interest in the club and the introduction of the under 10 competition should help our position. Our immediate problems are the under 16 and 18 grade teams. We require more players for the 1972 season and the present players can help to improve this present lack of numbers by canvassing among their friends at High School and in the district. Both of these teams have the nucleus of players to be much improved combinations next season.

CONCLUSION

This is my last Season as Secretary of the club and I have many regrets that I am unable to make myself available for the position next Season. In the eight years prior to my taking over the position the club had been well served by two notable Secretaries in Max White and Les James. During their term of office both of these gentlemen had set a very high standard of efficiency. I have endeavoured to maintain this standard and in doing so I have been assisted by many people who have all worked and teamed together with the common aim of promoting Junior Football within our district. Youth activities are a very rewarding and fulfilling experience and during my three years as Secretary I have made many good friends in the club and at Junior Council level. I have derived a great deal of pleasure and personal satisfaction from my association with club officials, parents and players.

We have a very fine club at Coolbinia and I sincerely hope the years ahead are full of success and enjoyment for our many officials and players.
