SOUTH AUSTRALIAN TRIP REPORT

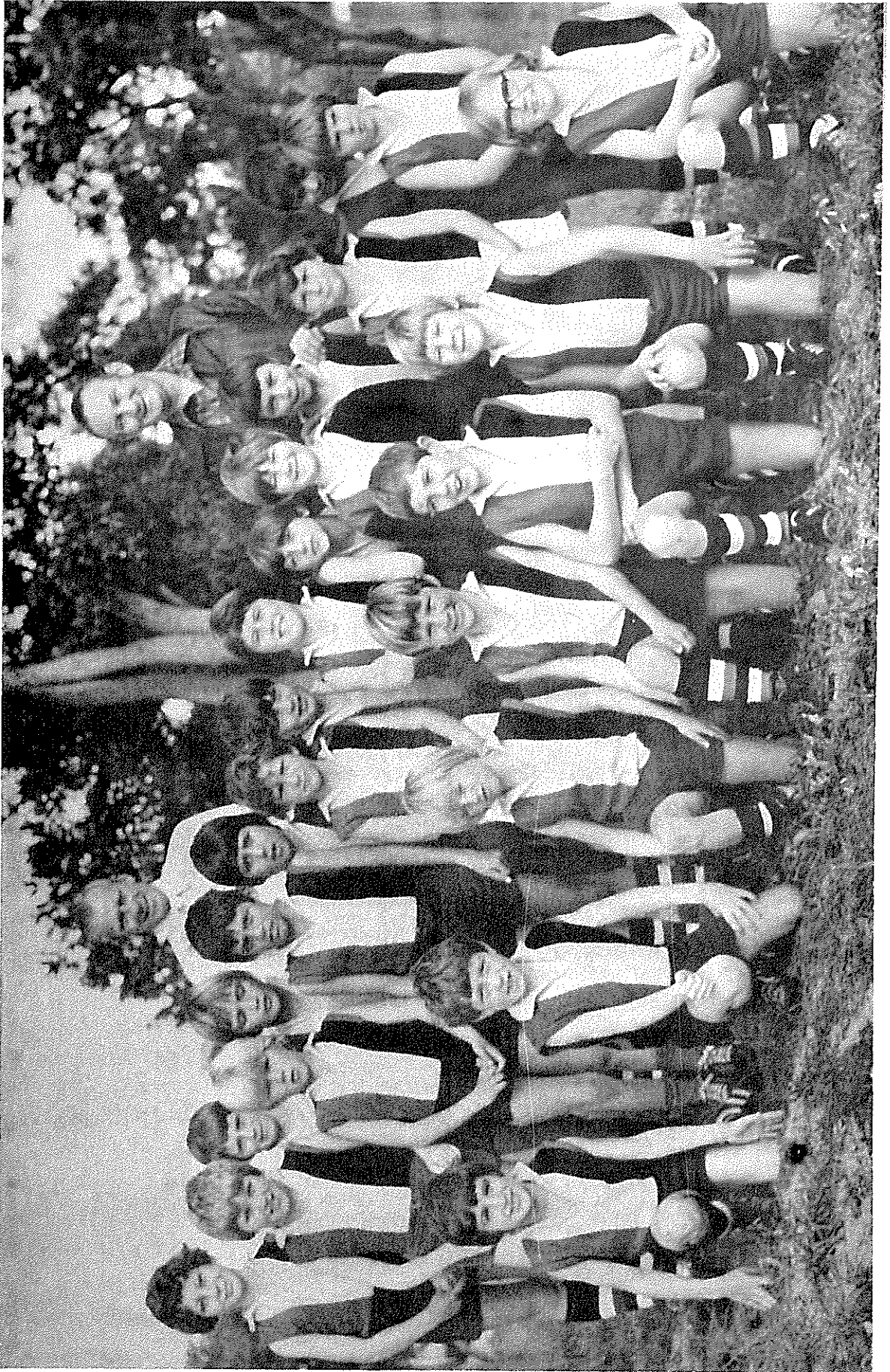

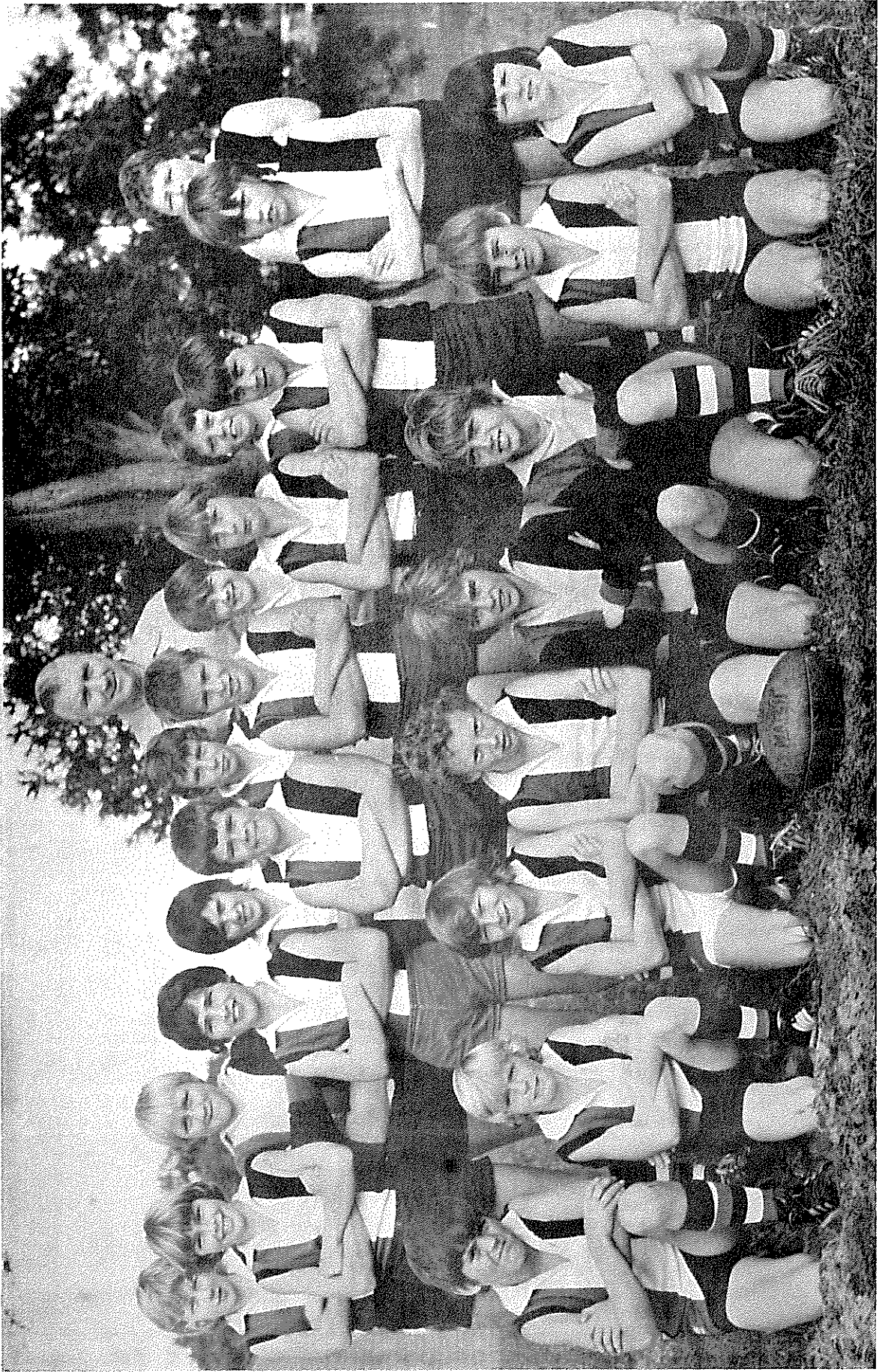
Under 12 Team Coaches Report

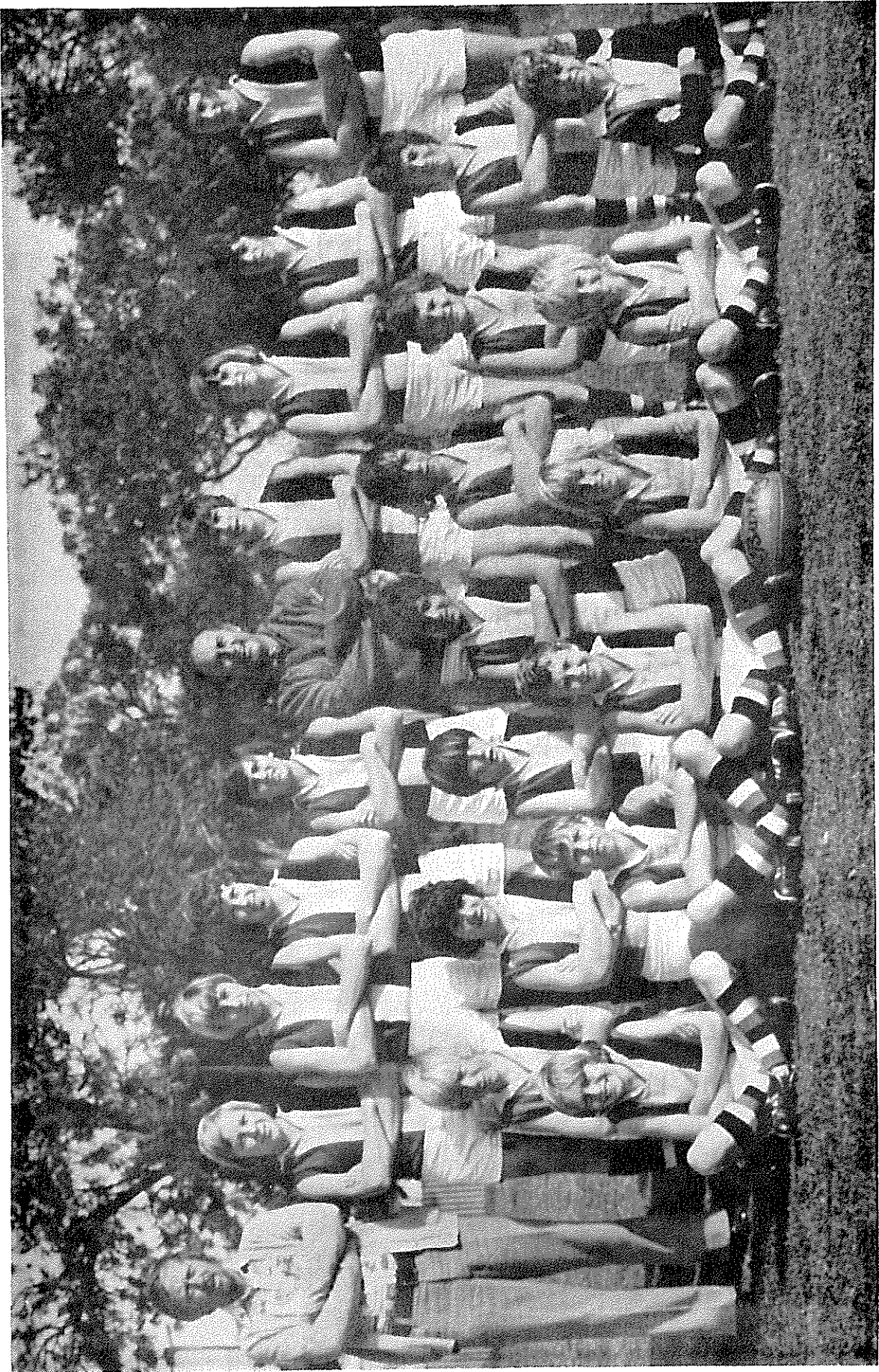

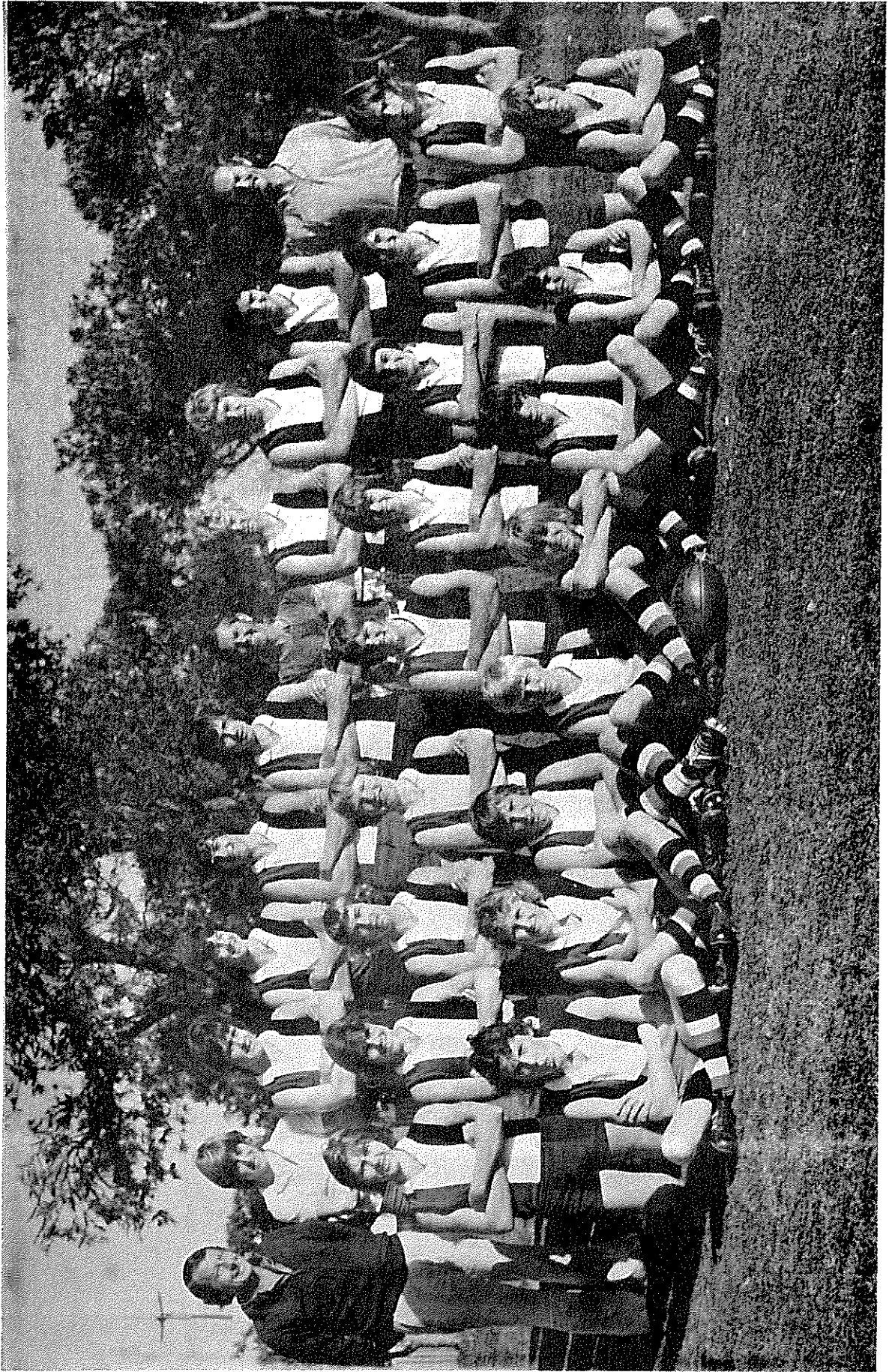

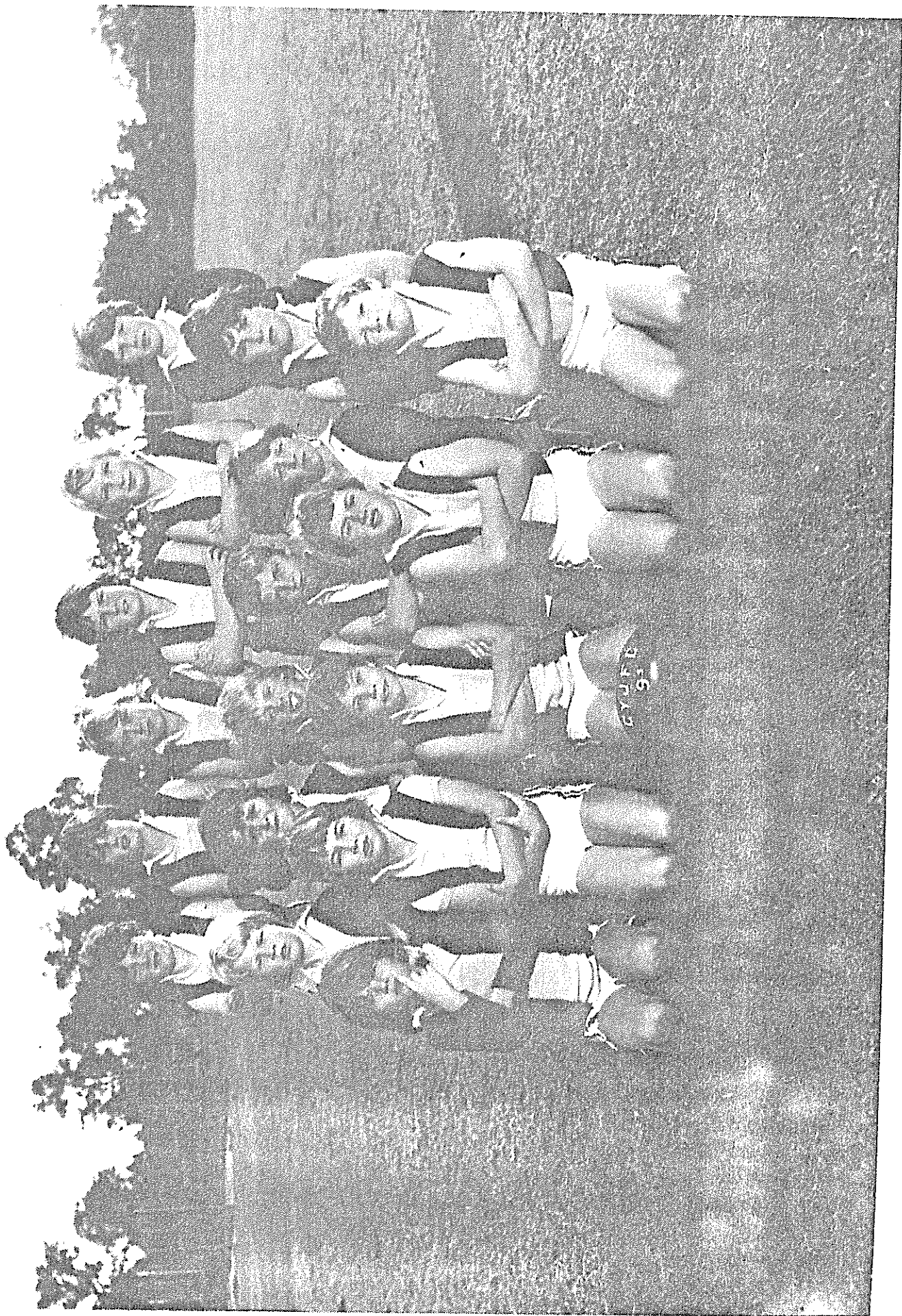

I had an extremely enjoyable time with the greatest bunch of kids I know and when tied up with a magic club like Coolbinia nothing could ever go wrong.

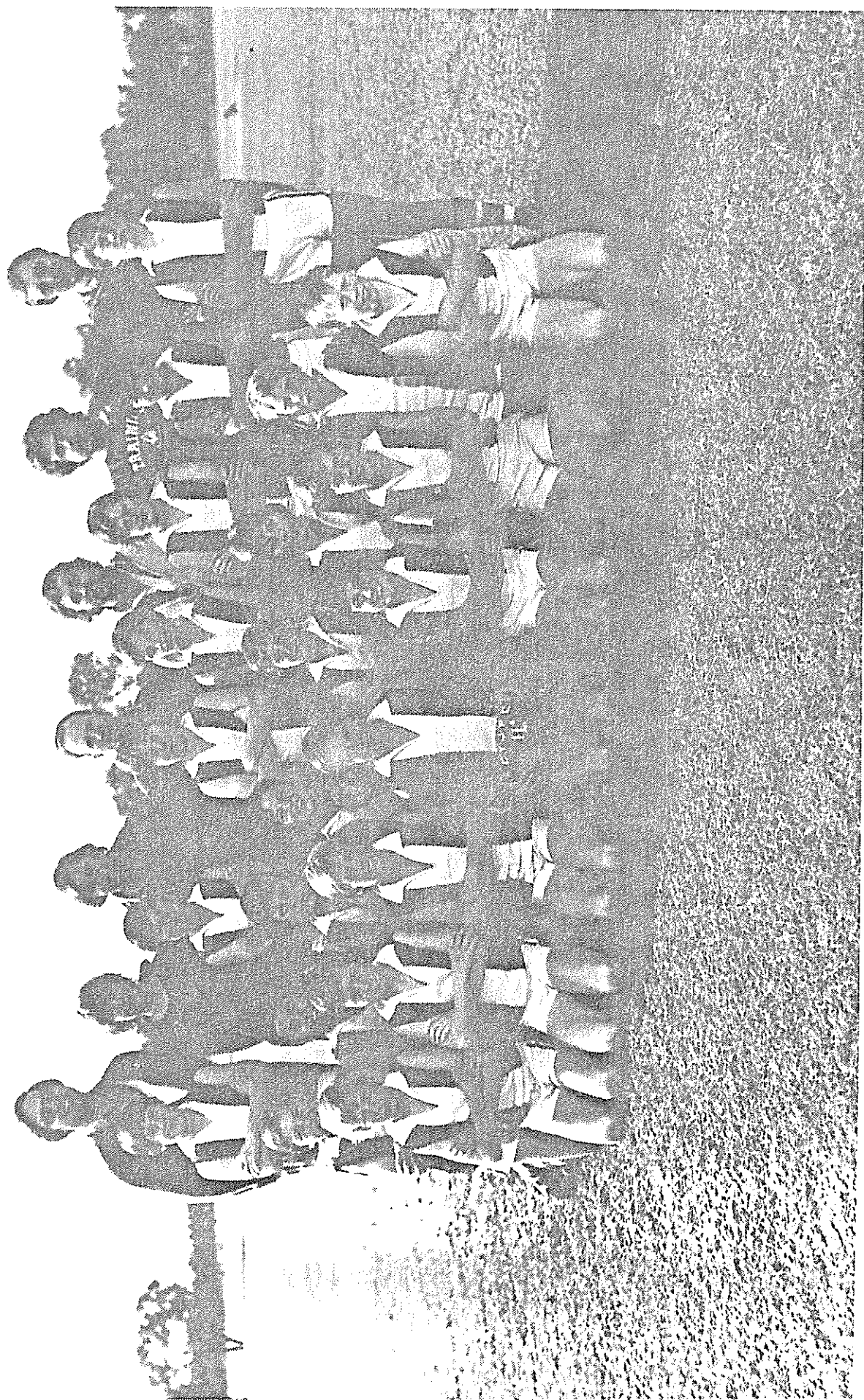

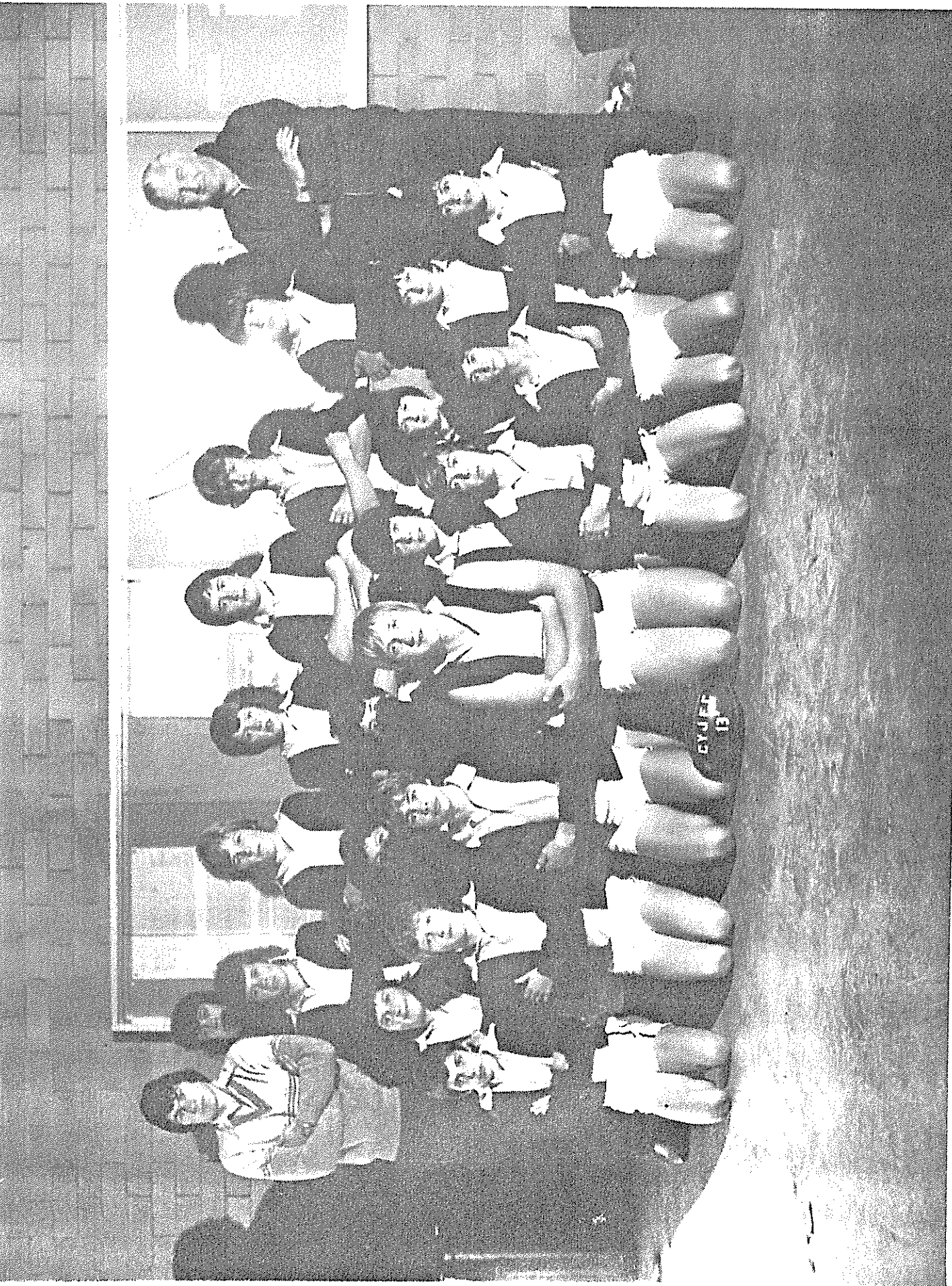

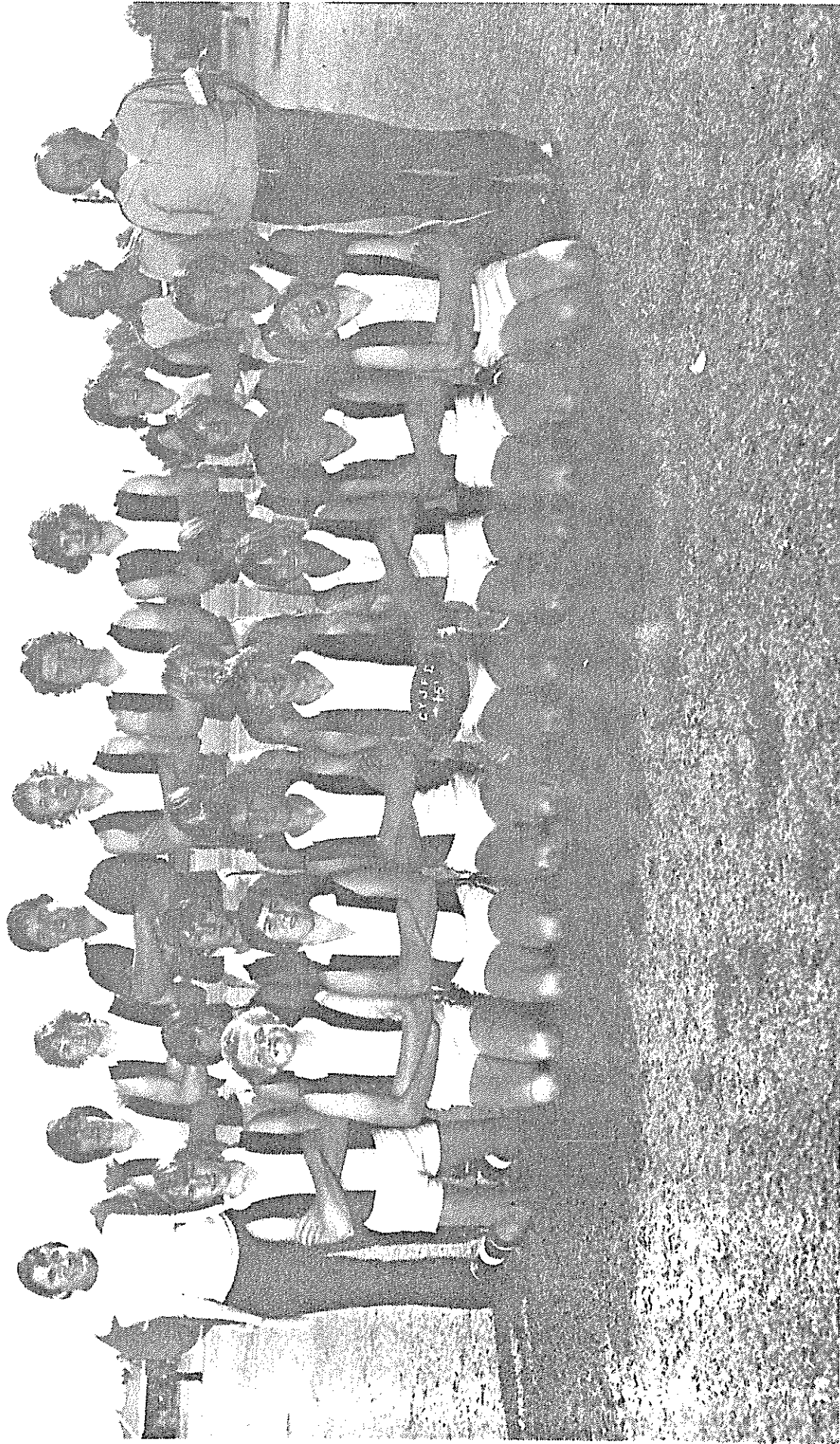
15's Grade Coaches Report.

Thank you Bruce Thornton and Peter Fare for your assistance this year as selectors off the field and Captain and Vice Captain respectively of the 17's side.

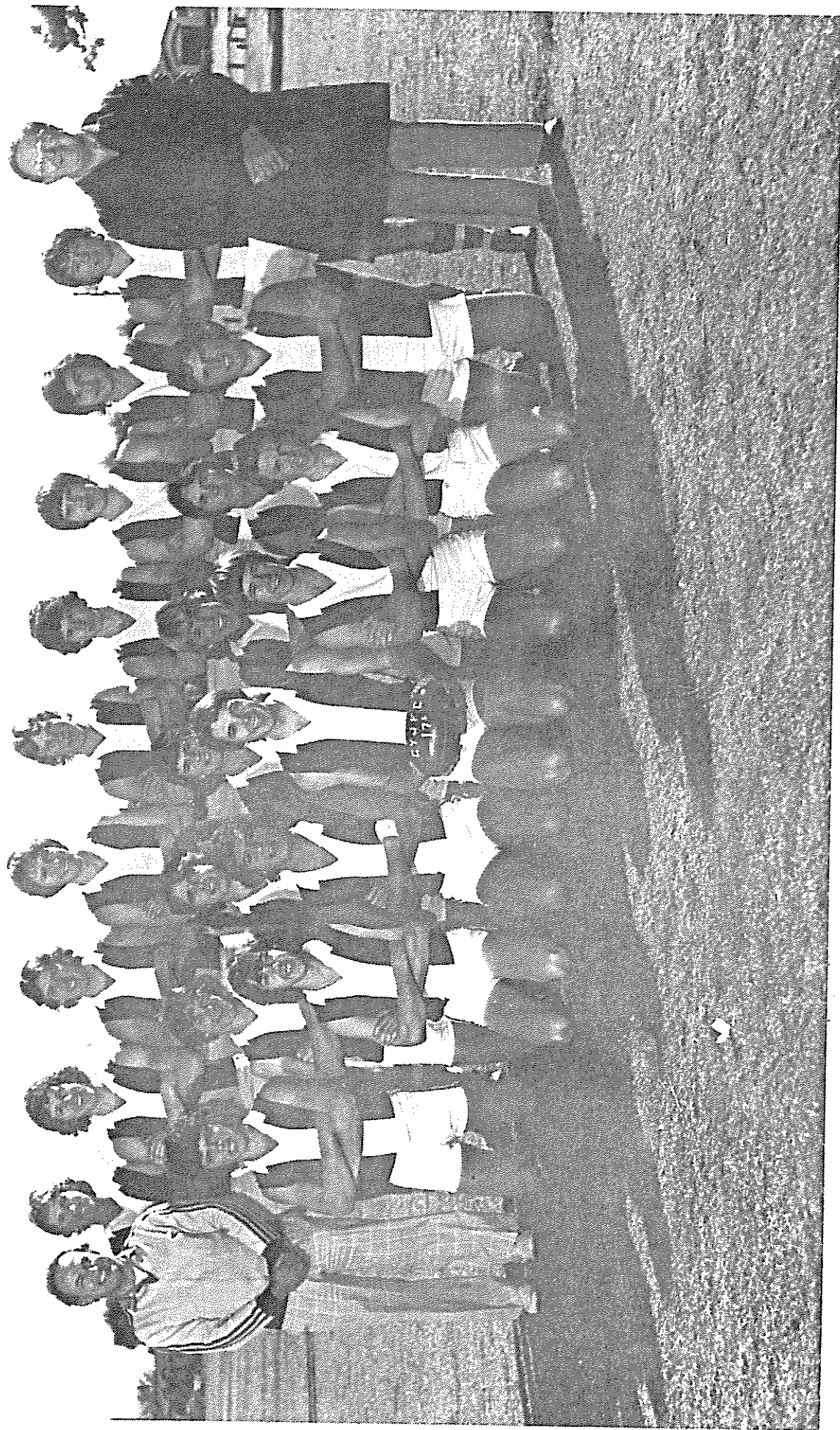
