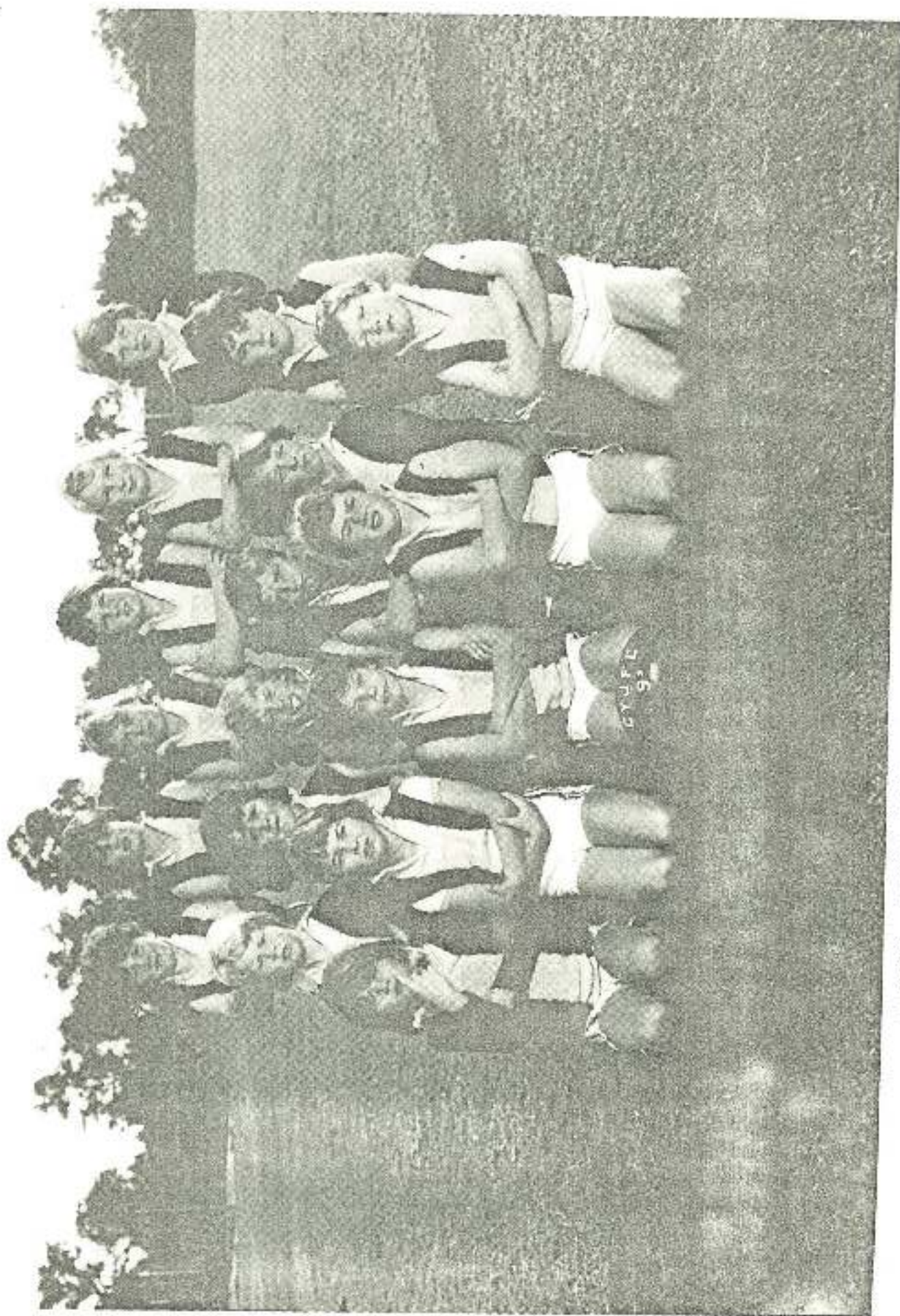
B's Grade Coaches Report.

I had an extremely enjoyable time with the greatest bunch of kids I know and when tied up with a magic club like Coolbinia nothing could ever go wrong.



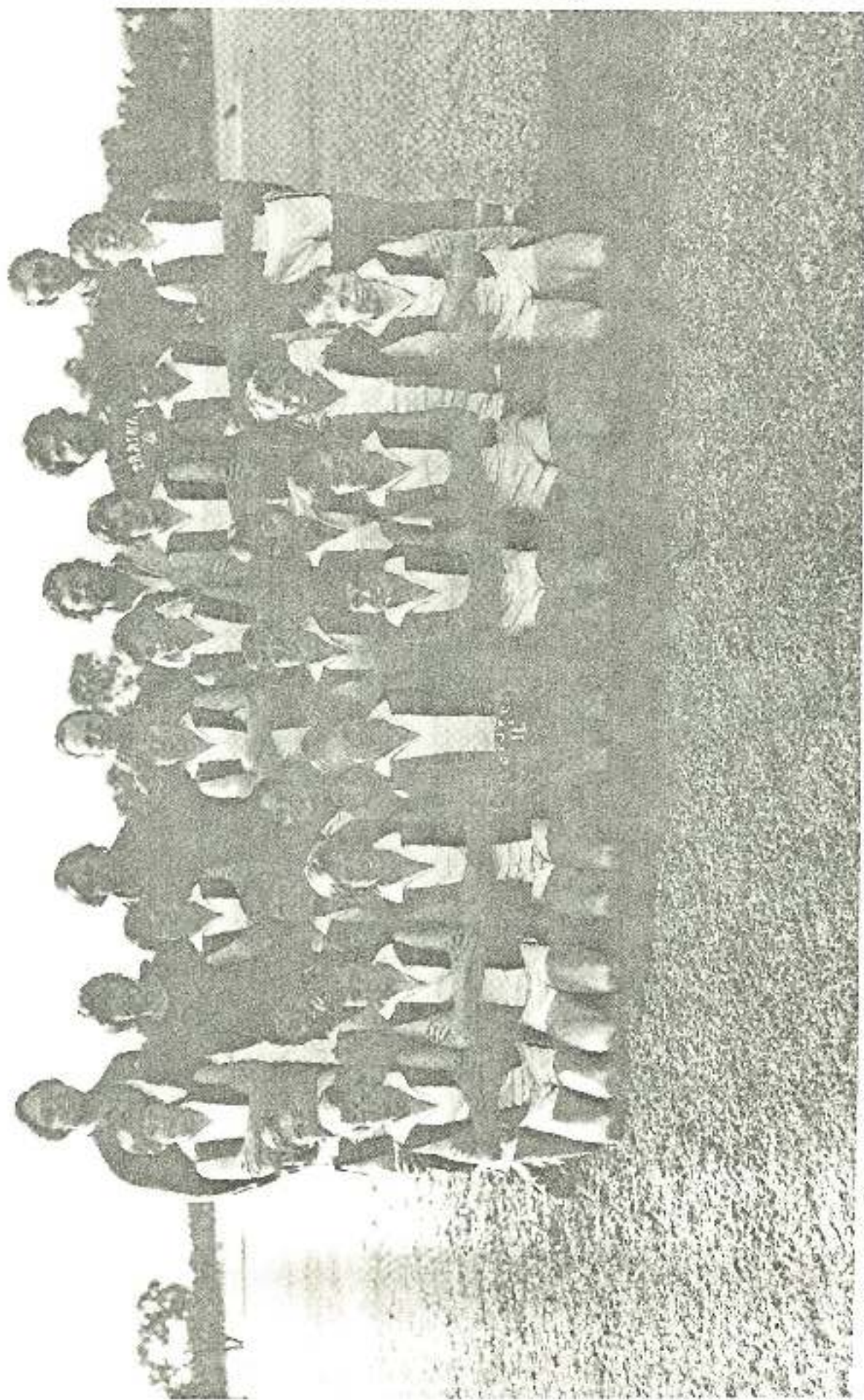

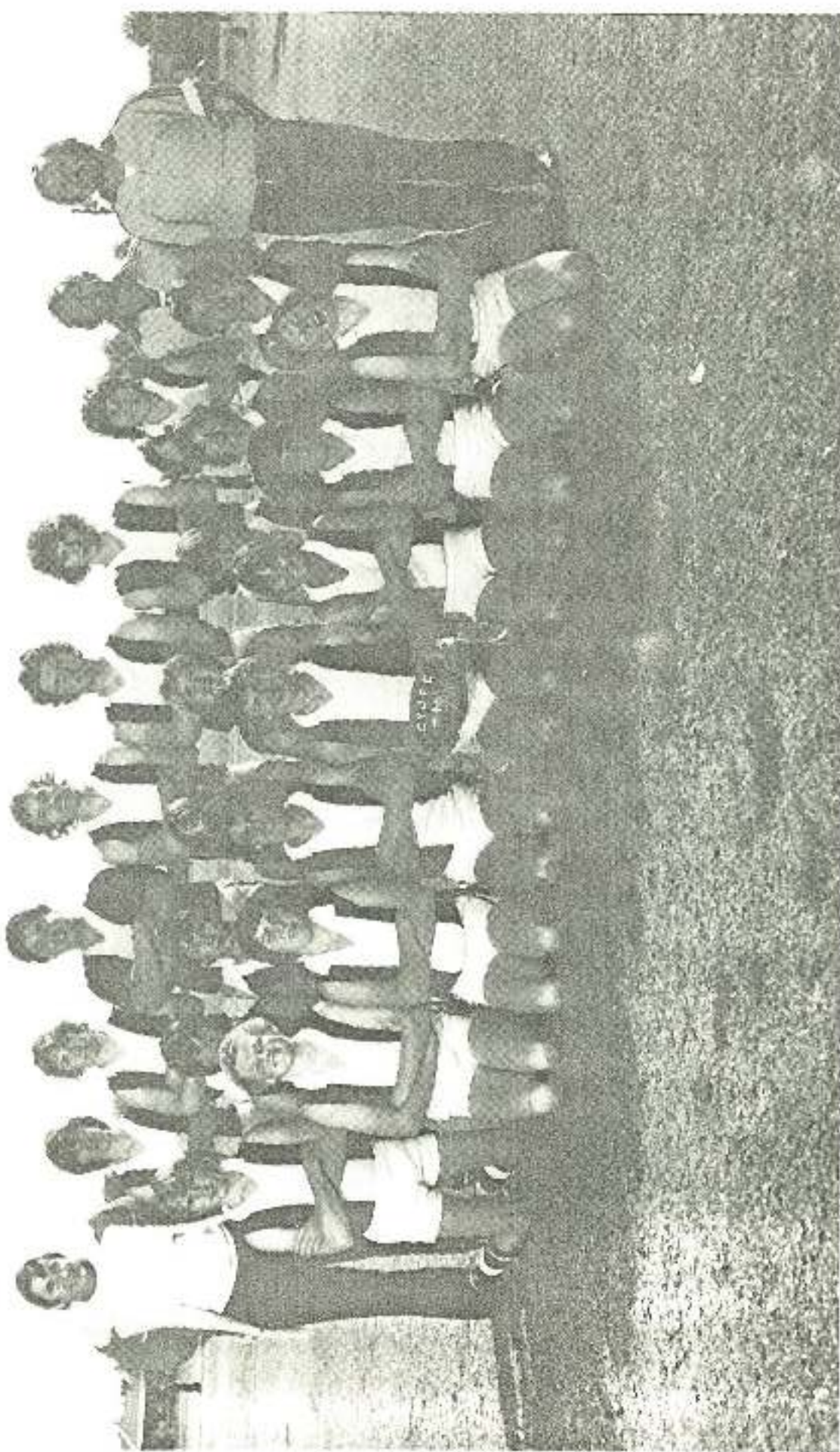
15's Grade Coaches Report.

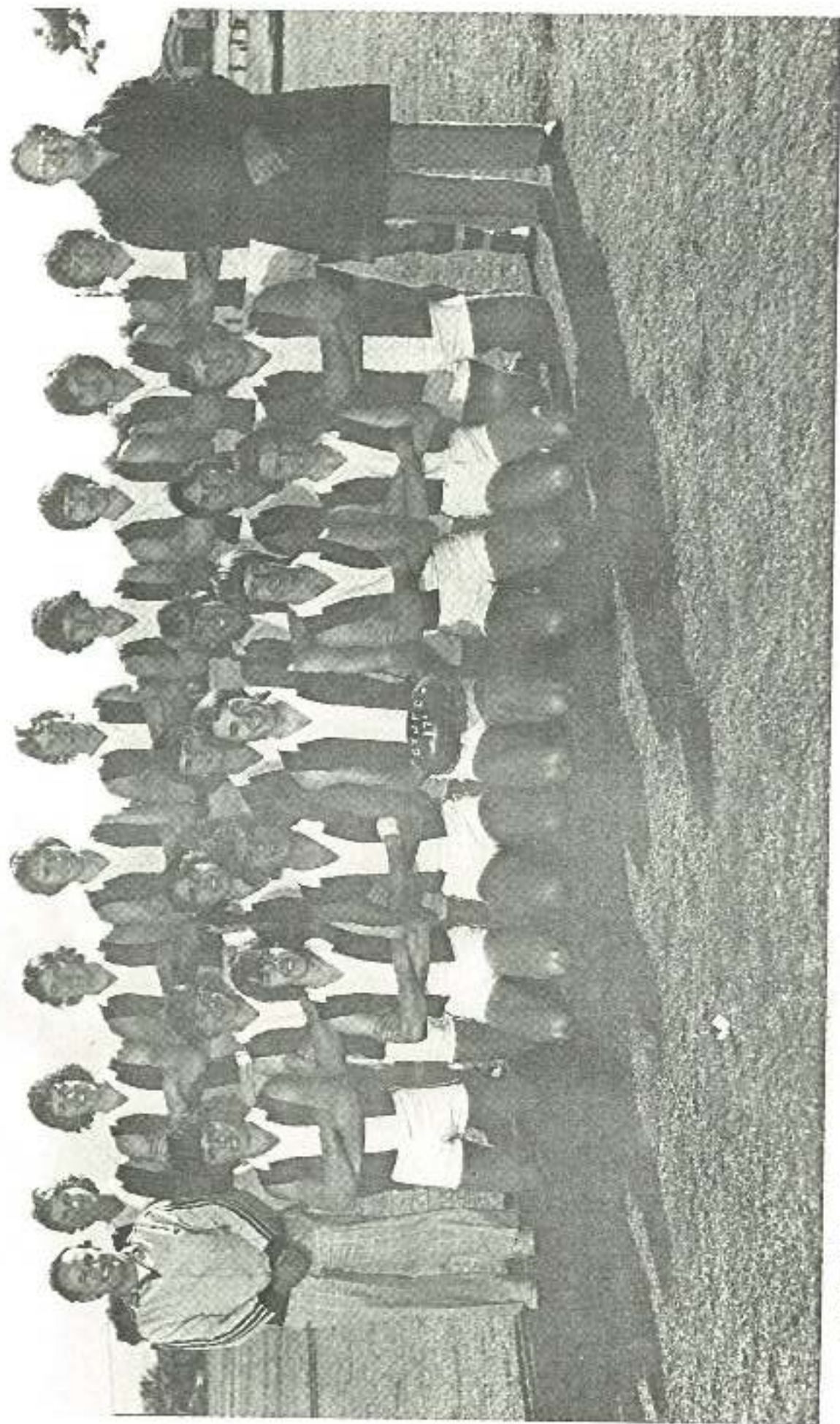
