#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Members and Players,

Club training started too late this season and by the time match day came around the 15's & 17's were really scratching for teams. One way or another we managed to field teams and I particularly thank the seventeens for "hanging in". With some hopeless beatings they continued to rally and the scores were not indicative of some of the individual's ability. Myself, with Dave Owens and the help of Scott Wright chased up players from wherever we could and defied the East Perth Junior Council's suggestion that we "scrub" the 17's.

All teams had some very good players and two in particular stood out, viz. Terry Doyle in the 15's and Ting Oh in the II's. Some of the boys remaining in the 17's for next year have latent ability and I hope they are trained hard next year. Two boys who came into football late in the year in Andrew Searle and Steven Lobo served the club well with some excellent games. "Lobo", as he is known to his mates, had not played Aussie Rules before and we all hope he doesn't kick that round ball again.

NOTE: Training will begin on the same day and times for next year beginning on the third week in February. Boots will not be worn until mid-March and training will be in the format of "fitness classes".

#### SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

Dave Owens, our social secretary, worked hard with the help of the old reliable crew and we had some nice functions, the most notable of which was the 'Nosh UP'. The girls arranged the trimmings and David & I rotisseried the most superb 60kg pig which was so tender it just fell to bits. Everyone raved and those who didn't come, "TOUGH LUCK". LUNCHES for 500 boys in the carnival were co-ordinated by Dave Owens and a team of girls. E.P.J.F.C. officials congratulated Dave and the club for a most efficient job done in record time and without a hitch, excepting the blowing of power fuses from overload from 6 pie warmers and 2 micro ovens.

#### COACH'S REPORT

#### 15's GRADE

It was a great honour to be given the opportunity of coaching the 15's Team this year.

Whilst there have been numerous frustrations along the way, many rewards have accrued to compensate.

It was my wish in the pre-season period to involve the boys in a comprehensive training program in order to prepare them adequately for the first match. Unfortunately, as in past years, lack of numbers hampered us and in many matches, we were unable to field a full side. Although the situation improved somewhat towards the middle of the year, it was still very difficult to be a competitive side.

Another big problem was the size of our boys compared to other sides such as Bayswater. There are many other players who improved markedly during the year and will obviously be valuable players next year. Proven talented players with Coolbinia, Doug Francis and Brad Wintle showed glimpses of outstanding play, and with more dedication and another year's growth, will improve greatly. I should also mention that William Gow unfortunately broke his wrist midway through the year. Up until this time, he was showing excellent form in the centre and it was most frustrating both for him and the team to have to miss the rest of the season. Thanks to Beth Thompson for looking after the teams' jumpers.


