



David is a great asset to the Club and we can all hope he will undertake the Secretary's role and continue to be a Manager next season. Thank you for all your efforts.

To all those that helped on training and game days, in the canteen and doing all the other jobs that just have to be done - thank you all.


The end of season party and presentation of certificates was a huge success and highlighted for me what a very successful year we enjoyed in Auskick.


